Background and motivation

The ESPCG mission is all about increasing knowledge and sharing best primary care practice in gastrointestinal disorders across Europe. Diagnosis and follow-up management of IBD is an increasing challenge for primary care doctors. We are constantly being told the world is changing for patients with IBD but how is this materialising? Recent informed opinion is the UK has fallen behind other European countries in the treatment of IBD. The arrival of new treatments has created challenges for primary care and how it can work most effectively with secondary care.
